<b>Motion to Enter Moderated Caucus</b>	Used for structured debate on more specific issues within a topic; delegate specifies purpose, length, & speaking time	Simple Majority (51%)	<i>Procedural</i>	Yes	No	No
<b>Motion to Enter Unmoderated Caucus</b>	Used for informal debate & discussion; delegate specifies purpose & length	Simple Majority (51%)	<i>Procedural</i>	Yes	No	No
<b>Motion to Introduce a Working Paper (Panel of Authors)</b>	Brings a working paper that has already been approved by the Chair to the floor for general debate. Chair may designate set amount of time for Q & A or discussion	No Vote (Required quorum of signatories)	—	No	No	No

<b>Motion to Close Debate/Enter voting procedure</b>	Ends all discussion on current topic & moves committee immediately into voting. Voting requirements follow individual committee rules (2/3ds majority default)	2/3 Majority	<b>Substantive</b>	Yes	No	1 for/ 1 against
<b>Motion to Introduce an Unfriendly Amendment</b>	Brings an amendment that has already been approved by the Chair to the floor for general debate & a vote when debate is closed on the resolution	No Vote (Required quorum of signatories)	—	No	No	1 for/ 1 against
<b>Motion to Divide the Question</b>	Resolution splits into multiple parts for voting: clause by clause unless otherwise specified	2/3 Majority	<i>Procedural</i>	Yes	—	1 for/ 1 against
<b>Clause voting</b>	Voting on Working papers/Draft Resolution/Amendment	2/3 Majority	<b>Substantive</b>	—	—	—
<b>Motion to Reconsider</b>	Reopen debate on a topic that has previously been tabled (voted upon without achieving a resolution)	2/3 Majority	<b>Substantive</b>	Yes	No	1 for/ 1 against
<b>Motion to Suspend Debate</b>	Used to suspend committee proceedings for meals, other scheduled breaks	2/3 Majority	<i>Procedural</i>	Yes	No	No
<b>Motion to Adjourn the Meeting</b>	Used to end the committee	2/3 Majority	<i>Procedural</i>	Yes	No	No
